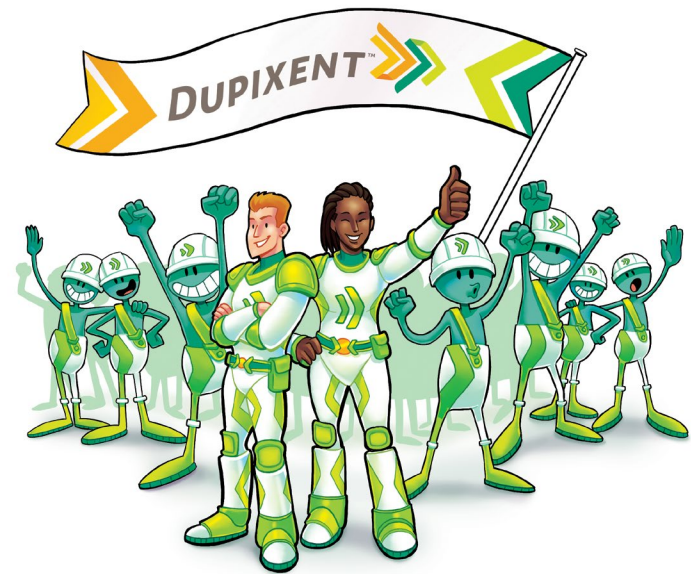

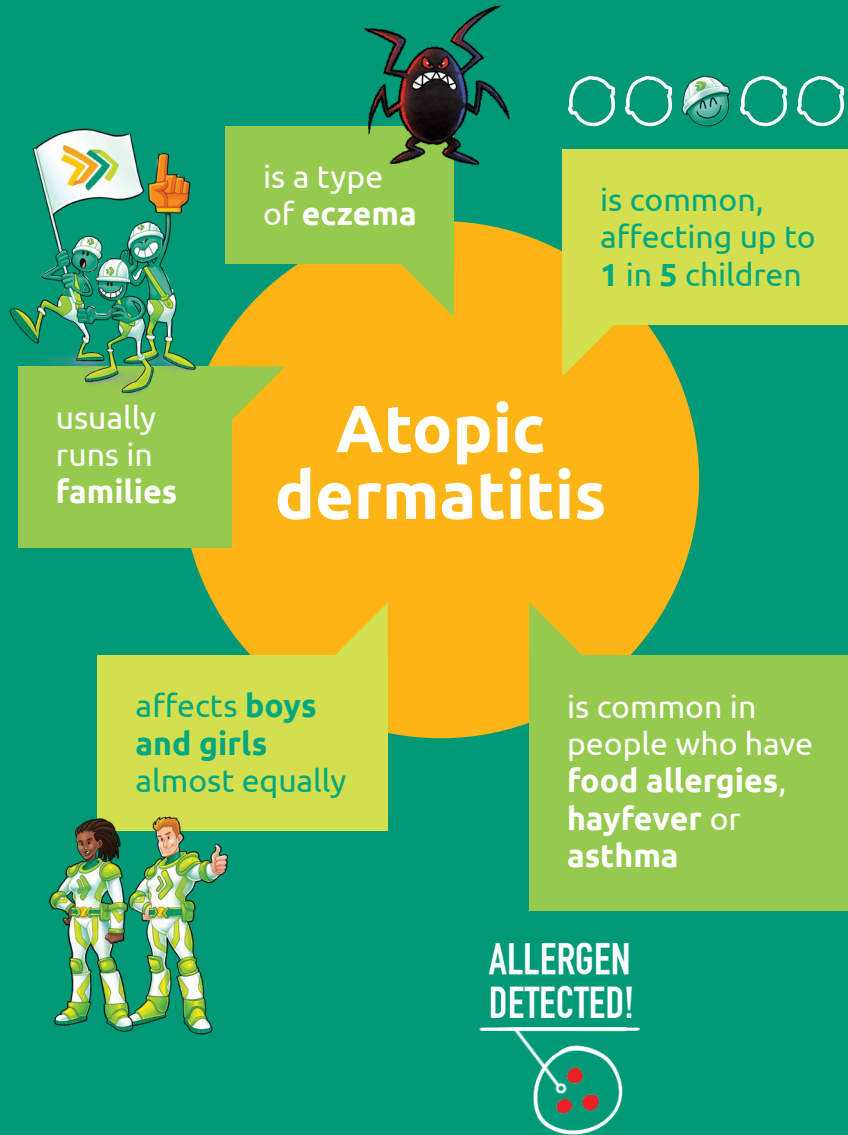

WHAT IS SEVERE ECZEMA?

Helpful information for you and those around you



SEVERE ECZEMA

Severe eczema (also known as 'atopic dermatitis') is a skin condition that can last a **long time**. It can make your skin feel itchy, dry, cracked, red, or sore.

It is a type of **allergy** (AL-ur-jee), which means that your body is having a bad reaction to something. This may include pollen, dust, soap, pet fur, and more. We call these triggers. Different people have different triggers.

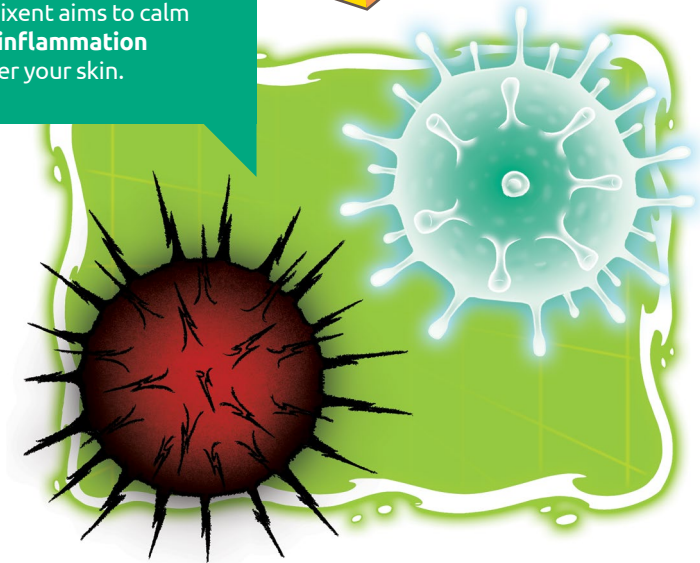
WHAT DO 'IMMUNE CELLS' HAVE TO DO WITH SEVERE ECZEMA?

We'll learn more about **immune cells** (IM-yoon sells) in this chapter. Some immune cells live under the skin and usually **protect you** from harmful things like germs.

If you have severe eczema, however, your immune cells can get confused and react badly to **triggers** like pet fur or pollen (that aren't harmful) and become overactive. We call this **inflammation** (IN-flam-ay-shun). This can make your skin red and itchy.

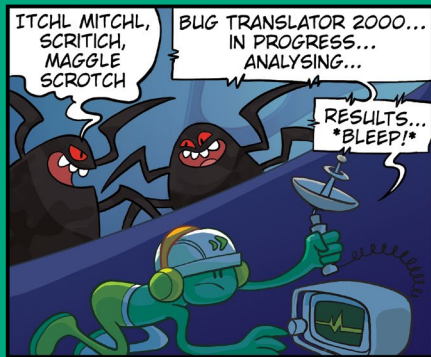
About Dupixent

*Remember, Dupixent can also have other effects that you aren't expecting (side effects) so it is important to tell a parent or caregiver if you feel unwell or not right after taking your new medicine so they can contact a doctor or nurse if needed.

- 1 In severe eczema, immune cells under the skin can become too active. This is called inflammation, and it can make your skin **red** and **itchy**
- 2 Dupixent aims to **calm this inflammation**, and make the skin **clearer** and **less itchy than before**
- 3 Dupixent may take a while to work. It is normally a **long-term treatment**, which means you should keep taking it as often as your doctor tells you to
- 4 It is important to tell a parent or caregiver if you do not feel right after taking your medicine

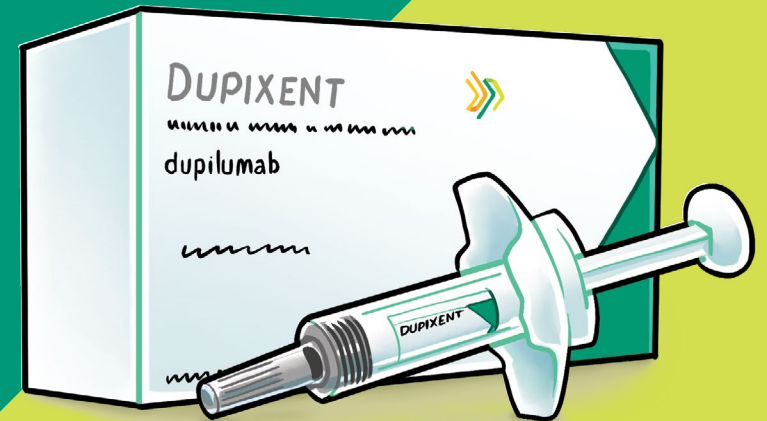

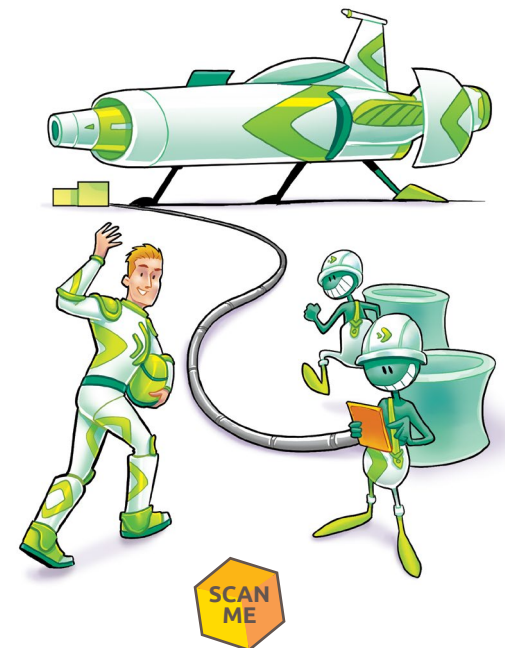
HOW IS DUPIXENT DIFFERENT?

Unlike other medicines you may have had, Dupixent is given by an injection. This allows the medicine to get to the right part of the body to allow it to work properly.

It's natural to be a little worried, but it won't take long, and we're sure you'll be brave! Make sure you talk to your parent or caregiver beforehand if you have any questions.

You will still need to keep using your **skin cream** (or 'topical corticosteroids') as your doctor has told you.

Dupixent will try to calm the inflammation, which may make your skin less itchy, and more clear than before!



BEFORE YOUR INJECTION...

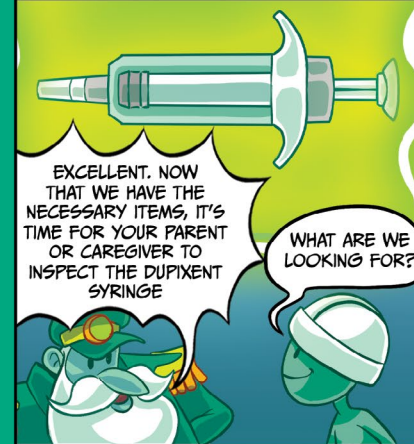

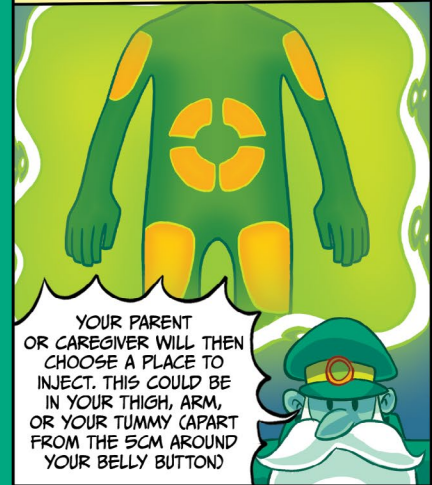

YOUR PARENT OR CAREGIVER WILL THEN CHOOSE A PLACE TO INJECT. THIS COULD BE IN YOUR THIGH, ARM, OR YOUR TUMMY (APART FROM THE SCM AROUND YOUR BELLY BUTTON)

*This time may be different depending on what dose you have been given. You will have to wait 30 minutes for your medicine to warm up to room temperature if you have been prescribed Dupixent 200 mg, or 45 minutes for Dupixent 300 mg.

**MISSION 5 FOR YOUR PARENT OR CAREGIVER:
CLEAN!**



OK, TO ENSURE NO NASTY GERMS ARE LURKING, YOUR PARENT OR CAREGIVER WILL WIPE THE AREA WITH AN ALCOHOL WIPE!

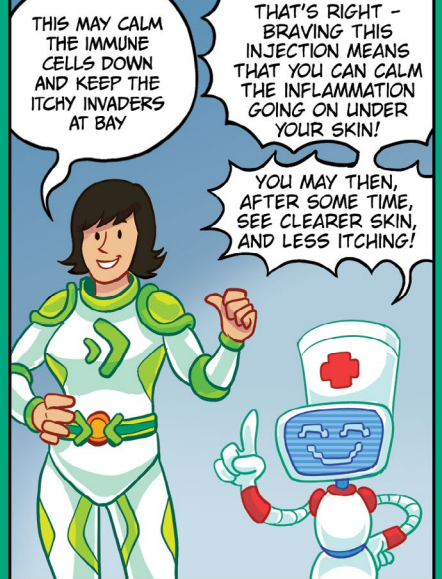

MISSION: COMPLETE!

WHAT WILL THIS DO?

Dupixent can be an effective treatment for severe eczema, but it is not a cure. This means it won't get rid of your condition, but it should calm the symptoms you get, like skin that is red, itchy, sore, or dry.

Because of this, you need to take Dupixent as and when your doctor has told you to. It is normally a long-term treatment.

What if it's already working?

You need to take Dupixent as your doctor says, even if you've already seen results, because it will allow Dupixent to continue to work.

What if it hasn't worked yet?

Dupixent can take a while to work, and results may be different from person to person. You should keep taking it as your doctor tells you.



Dupixent can be administered by a parent or caregiver if they have had proper training on the preparation and administration of Dupixent prior to use. Please refer to the patient information leaflet in the pack for full safety information and instructions for injection. Talk to your healthcare professional if you are unsure of how to administer Dupixent or if you have any questions.

SPOT THE HIDDEN OBJECTS!

Before your Dupixent injection, your parent or caregiver needs to gather **four items**:

- Dupixent pre-filled syringe (which comes in a carton)
- Puncture-resistant container
- Alcohol wipe
- Cotton ball or gauze

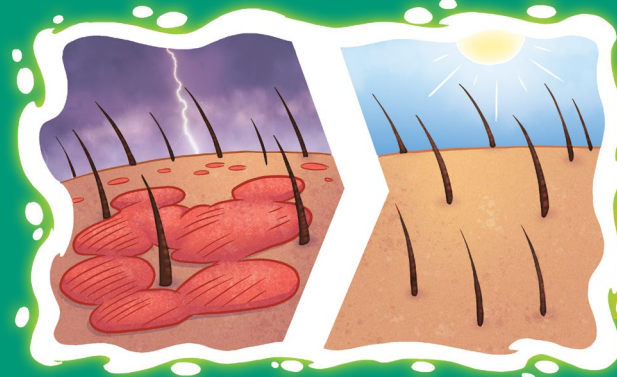
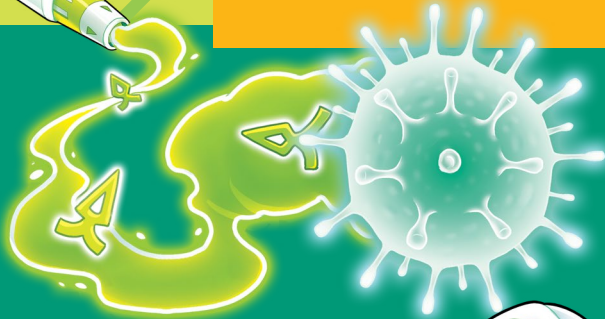

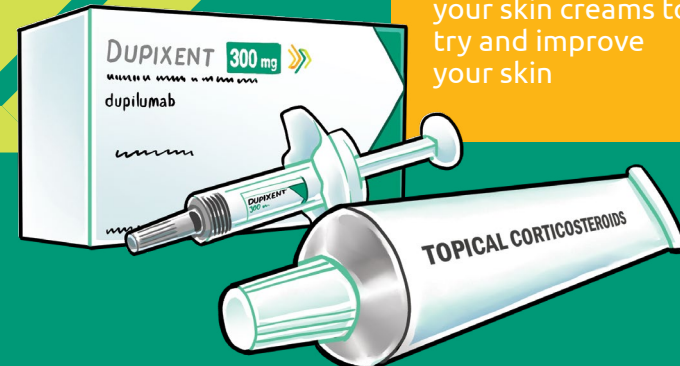

GLOSSARY

GLOSSARY

Allergy	If you have an allergy (say: AL-ur-jee), it means your body is having a bad reaction to something. This can be things like dust, soap or grass.
Allergen	Things that can cause allergic reactions are called 'allergens' (say: AL-ur-jens). Dust, soap and pollen can all be allergens.
Atopic dermatitis	Atopic dermatitis is another name for eczema. It is a skin condition that can last a long time. It can make your skin feel itchy, dry, cracked, red, or sore.
Chronic	Chronic (say: kron-ik) means 'for a long time'. Eczema is a chronic condition.
Eczema	Eczema is a skin condition that can last a long time. It can make your skin feel itchy, dry, cracked, red or sore.

GLOSSARY

Flare-up	If you have eczema, you may have flare-ups, which is when your skin suddenly gets worse. It may become red and itchy.
Immune cells	Immune cells (say: IM-yoon sells) are part of your immune system. They act like guardians of the body, helping to find invaders like germs and trying to get rid of them.
Immune system	Your immune system (say: IM-yoon sis-tem) helps you defend your body from invaders, like germs, to keep you healthy. If you have eczema, it may get confused and over-react to things like pollen or dust, for example. This can make your skin red and itchy.
Inflammation	If you have eczema, your immune system can get confused and become overactive. We call this inflammation (say: IN-flam-ay-shun). This can make your skin red and itchy.

GLOSSARY

Itch-scratch cycle

If you have eczema, scratching can make your skin worse – it can damage your skin and let in more triggers, which only makes it itch more! It may be very difficult sometimes but try not to scratch because the more you scratch, the more you itch.

Triggers

Triggers are things that make your eczema worse. This may include pollen, dust, soap, pet fur, and more. Different people may have different triggers.

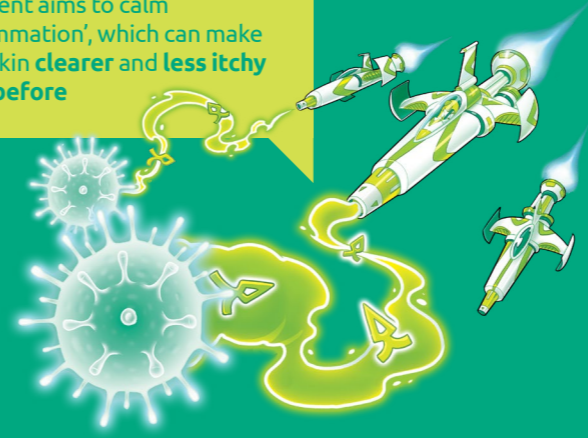

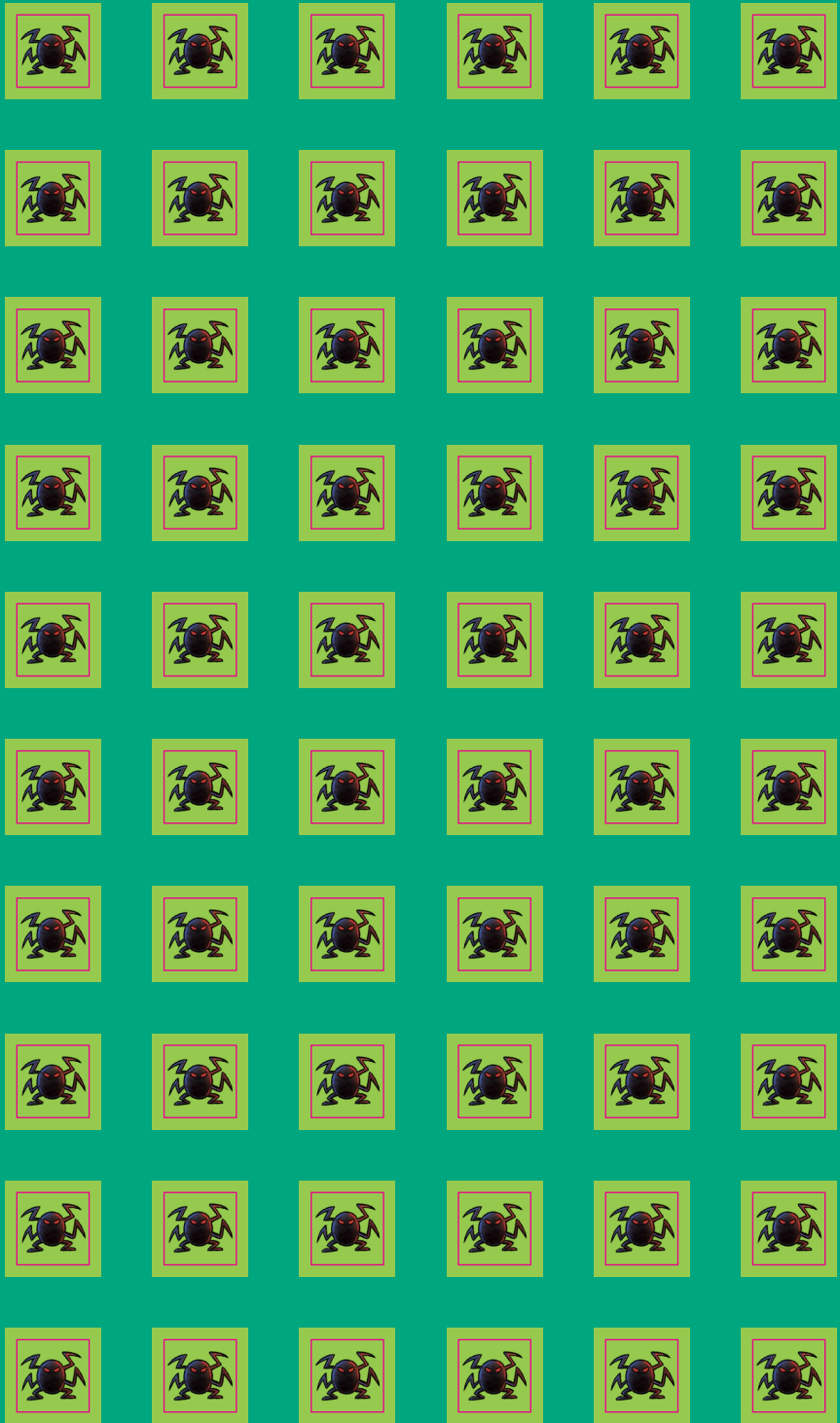
